CCA Northern Va is asking for our help. The following is an excerpt from an email I received from the Hickory Shad Conservation Coordinator. I have included the letter that was attached to the email. I am including the letter in case any individual would like to get involved with this situation. This is not necessarily the opinion of the PSWSFA as we have not discussed the topic in any of our meetings:

The harvest of Hickory Shad in Virginia currently has no limitations!!

- Unlike its' close relative the American Shad, which is a protected species in Virginia and adjacent jurisdictions, there are no regulations in Virginia regulating the harvest of Hickory Shad. The result has been the spectacle of large numbers of Hickory Shad being taken from their Spring spawning grounds with cast nets, hook and line, and any other means available, without regard for the future of the species.
- CCA Northern Virginia has taken the initiative to remedy this situation by proposing changes to the regulations on the harvest of Hickory Shad.
- Earlier this year CCA Nova began the process with a presentation by two of its' members to the VMRC that included a very detailed and convincing Power Point Presentation that described the problem, and proposed changes in the regulations. (attached) Included was the proposal for a reasonable recreational bag limit.
- The presentation was well received by VMRC, which then **requested letters of support** from stakeholders supporting the change in regulations before they would proceed.
- I recently spoke with Patrick Geer, Chief of the Virginia Marine Fisheries Commission, and Jeff Deem, Chairman of the Finfish Management Advisory Committee, and they are awaiting our letters of support to start the review and approval process.

We are asking for your support!

• Attached is a sample letter to Pat Geer; it outlines the issues and the need for additional regulations. Please feel free to modify the letter, and send it to Pat Geer; with a copy to me so I can track the responses.

Re: Responsible Hickory Shad Management

Dear Mr. Geer:

Hickory Shad have an important role to play in Virginias' marine and estuary ecosystems. They are currently a protected species (moratorium on harvest) in Maryland, the District of Columbia, and the waters under the jurisdiction of the Potomac River Fisheries Commission.

In contrast, Virginia does not have any creel limit on the harvest of Hickory Shad; and they may be taken with hook-an d-line, cast nets, seines, and gill nets. Concerned about the historic decline in abundance, and a lack of Creel Limits in Virginia, two members of the CCA Northern Virginia Chapter; Wayne Lumsden, and Wayne Young delivered a Power Point presentation (attached) to the Virginia Marine Resources Commission (VMRC) on February 25, 2019 indicating their concerns. Their presentation included observations of excessive harvest of staging and spawning Hickory Shad by cast nets, dip nets, and multiple hook mini-longlines at and near the Fall Line during the Spring 2018 recreational fishery in Virginia's Rappahannock River and Occoquan River.

Their presentation concluded by encouraging the Commission to consider establishing a "rod and reel" only recreation al fishery, a modest creel limit informed by best available fishery information, and bans on cast nets, dip nets, and mult iple hooks greater than two per line. In response, the VMRC requested evidence of support for these regulations from the recreational fishing community.

We support the Northern Virginia Chapter of CCA and its' request for new regulations based on the facts that were pre sented to the Commission. We believe these conservative fishery management actions would serve the Commonwea Ith and its citizens well by conserving the Hickory Shad stock and maintaining a quality recreational fishery. These mea sures would also correspond with and better support conservation measures adopted by fishery management authoriti es elsewhere in the region in response to Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commissions Fishery Management Plan for American and Hickory Shad.

We look forward to hearing from you as you evaluate these proposed changes to managing the Hickory Shad Fishery.

State Record Albacore Tuna Landed

A 70-pound 11-ounce Albacore Tuna, sometimes referred to as "True" Albacore or Longfin Tuna, caught on September 22, 2019 by Wendy Brockenbrough of Virginia Beach, VA, has been certified as a Virginia State Record by the Virginia Saltwater Fishing Tournament.

Brockenbrough caught the record tuna while deep dropping for swordfish at the Washington Canyon aboard the private boat Sea Trader skippered by Shey Mahoney. The record catch was made using a 50-pound class custom rod mated to a Shimano 80 reel loaded with 100-pound braided line and baited with a large strip of fresh dolphin belly. Seated in the fighting chair Ms. Brockenbrough was able work the fish to the boat in about 20 minutes. The fish was checkedin at Fisherman's Wharf Marina, registering 70 pounds and 11 ounces on a recently certified digital scale. The tuna measured 52 inches in total length, had a 47-1/2-inch fork length and sported a 34-inch girth.

Brockenbrough's catch erases Virginia's initial and current state record of 68 pounds, set September 2, 1992, at the Norfolk Canyon by Irv Fenton, Jr. The IGFA All-Tackle World Record stands at 88 pounds, 2 ounces and was caught off the coast of Spain in November 1977.

Call to Action

Hold Canadian-Owned Menhaden Harvester Accountable

Anglers sign petition to uphold non-compliance finding against company ignoring Chesapeake Bay conservation measures

Omega Protein, the sole commercial harvester of East Coast menhaden, has brazenly announced that it knowingly went over its menhaden quota by almost **35 million pounds**. The foreign-owned company harvested 67,000 metric tons (147,668,000 pounds) of menhaden from Virginia waters of the Chesapeake Bay and has been unapologetic about its intentions to no longer abide by the harvest cap lawfully set by the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission (ASMFC).

For this reason, the ASMFC voted unanimously in October to find the state of Virginia out of compliance with its menhaden fishery management plan. Virginia is the only East Coast state that still allows reduction harvesters in state waters. Commercial harvest of menhaden in the Chesapeake Bay has been under intense scrutiny for decades due to its concentrated removals of a critical food source for striped bass and other important sportfish in their primary spawning grounds on the East Coast. Some studies indicate the menhaden fishery could be reducing striped bass populations by as much as 30 percent.

Anglers have applauded the ASMFC for its decision to find the State of Virginia out of compliance due to the careless actions of Omega Protein and are now calling on U.S. Commerce Secretary Wilbur Ross to uphold that finding and ensure that no one is allowed to willfully ignore U.S. laws and regulations.

By signing this petition, you will be joining thousands of conservationists in their call for Secretary Ross to defend the marine resources of the United States and shut down the menhaden fishery in Virginia until Omega Protein comes back into compliance with the fishery management plan.


















- Leaving a message will be sufficient to register, give all anglers names (specify club members and club guest), and also give a phone number.
- Guest(s) must fish with at least one member on boat/shore/pier/kayak
- Use a club "Official Entry Form" and weigh in fish at any Va. Saltwater Tournament official weigh station. Record the
 weight of fish, date and time caught and have the weigh master sign the form to verify catch. If two identical fish are
 caught on the same day, the earlier fish wins. That is why time is so important. Triple Threat entries require witness
 or photo since this is a length total tourney.
- All pertinent PSWSFA bylaws apply.

With the fish lying on a flat surface, measure in quarter inch increments, from the tip of the mouth to the tip of the tail with the fish in a natural position and the mouth closed.
